Phonics


We follow the Read, Write, Inc (RWI) programme daily in school to support the teaching of phonics.

Writing

Reading

MATHS

Multiplication and Division

COMPUTING

Moving a robot

In Computing we will be learning how to make a robot move. We will understand why it is important to give precise instructions and what happens if we do not. We will be creating algorithms using different commands and different routes. We will test our algorithms out with floor robots.

SCIENCE

Animals including Humans

In Science, we are learning about animals including humans with a focus on the different parts of the human body.

KNITTED KNOWLEDGE AND SUPER SKILLS

I can talk about which parts of our bodies we use for different activities.

I know and can talk about the 5 senses.

I can explore the sense of sight, touch, smell, taste and hearing.

I know which part of the body is associated with which sense and can label accordingly.

I can identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals.

I can identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.

RELIGION AND WORLDVIEWS

Why is Joseph a Bible hero?

In Religion and Worldviews we will be learning about Joseph and why he is a Bible hero. We will explore the story in detail and discuss the actions and feelings of the different characters, relating this to the children's own experiences. We will also learn more about the nature and characteristics of God. We will know that the story of Joseph is one from the Old Testament.

PE

In PE this half term we are taking part in **Athletics** on Mondays and **Net and Wall games** on Thursdays.

We will continue to do our mile run on a daily basis.
