Dear Parents,

It has been a very busy and positive start to the school year. With just two weeks left until half term, I write with some information about upcoming school events.

Harvest

On Friday 13th October we will be celebrating Harvest at St Michael's church. The service will be led by Ben and all classes will be involved in singing, reciting poems or reading from the Bible. Any donations for our service can be dropped off at school this week – there is a box in our school hall. These donations will support Carlisle Foodbank. Fresh fruit and vegetables are welcome, though dried or tinned foods are preferable as they last longer. Unfortunately, due to all pupils taking part in the service, regrettably there is not the physical space to open it up to the wider community.

Parents' Evening

Book Fair

Next week we will be hosting a Scholastic Book Fair in our school hall from 3.30-4pm every night and again for an extended period on parents' evenings. There will be an option to pay online using your credit/debit card with a QR code issued in school. School will be offered free books based on our total sales.

Cycling to School

It is great to see so many children cycling to and from school. In order to ensure that our pupils are safe, I would recommend that cycle helmets are worn. It has also been brought to my attention that some of our pupils are not being safe and/or considerate of road users. When dropping off and collecting their bikes, our pupils should walk with their bike in the playground for the safety and consideration of all playground users — thank you.
