## Library Visits

Our Reception, Year 1, 2, 3 and 4 pupils visited Carlisle library last week as part of our World Book Day celebrations. The trainer was delighted with our provision with school and was particularly pleased to see how our half termly pupil assessments inform our teaching and continue to challenge our pupils so that they can succeed. On Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> February several pupils from our Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 classes were chosen to meet with an experienced headteacher to share their thoughts and experiences of 'What life is like to be a pupil in St Michael's school'.
