ENGLISH

<u>Phonics</u>

We follow the Read, Write, Inc (RWI) programme daily in school to support the teaching of phonics.

Writing

We will be using our 'Get Writing' books as part of the RWI programme. Our writing will be linked to the RWI storybooks we read within our phonics lessons.

Reading

We will explore books by Colin McNaughton, such as 'Giant', 'Who's that banging on the ceiling?' and 'Goal!'. We will be answering questions about the stories linked to the VIPERS, (Vocabulary, Inference, Predict, Explain, Retrieve, Sequence and Summarise).
