A playscript is a piece of writing written for the stage. Within a playscript there are characters and acts split into individual scenes.


We will read, write and perform some playscripts.

SCIENCE What do we know about Earth and Space?



In Science we will provide the class with an opportunity for interesting topics for discussion, including the planets; the movement of the Sun, Earth and Moon; day and night; seasons and phases of the Moon.

PE will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

MATHS

Fractions - this half term the children will be:

- Comparing and ordering fractions whose denominators are all multiples of the same number.
- Converting from mixed numbers to improper fractions.
- Adding and subtracting fractions whose denominators are multiples of the same number.
- Multiplying proper fractions and mixed numbers by whole numbers.

Multiplication and Division - this half term the children will also be learning a variety of strategies for multiplying and dividing numbers. We will look at the practical methods and more formal written methods for recording our calculations.

GEOGRAPHY What is life like in South America?

South America Back

We will be finding out about the location and countries of South America. We will also learn about the climate, the physical and human geography and trade and industry there. We will conduct an in-depth study of an area of South America and compare it to an area in the UK.

RELIGION & WORLDVIEWS Old Testament Women: Did she make the right choice?



We will increase our knowledge and understanding of the role and significance of women in the Bible and in God's Big Story. We will reflect upon the actions of these women and consider what we can learn from their stories. We will explore the story of Esther and the Jewish festival of Purim.

ART

What is Installation Art?



In Art, we will be learning about installation art. We will analyse different artworks including the works of Cai Guo-Qiang and create our own 3D artworks, creating the effect of large-scale space. We will plan and create our own installations that communicate an idea.

PSHE

Dreams and Goals

Children will think about their hopes and dreams, their goals for success, what personal strengths are, and how to overcome challenges, via team work skills and tasks. There is also a focus on enterprise and fundraising. Children learn about experiencing and managing feelings of pride, ambition, disappointment, success; and they get to share their aspirations, the dreams and goals of others in different cultures/countries, and their dreams for the world.

COLLECTIVE WORSHIP

HOPE, COURAGE & ENDURANCE

PE

Fitness

The children will take part in a range of activities that explore and develop different areas of their health and fitness. They will learn different components of fitness including speed, stamina, strength, co-ordination, balance and agility.

Tag Rugby

Tag rugby is an invasion game. The children will develop their understanding of the attacking and defending principles of invasion games. They have to think about how they use skills, strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition.

MUSIC



This half term we are learning the song 'Make You Feel My Love'. As well as learning to sing, play, improvise and compose with this song, children will listen and appraise other pop ballads.
