


Year 2 Home Learning: Week 7, Daily Activities

ENGLISH <i>Reading</i>	Try to read for 20 minutes a day and complete your reading record. See the VIPERS document below for some questions you could discuss with an adult. This week's book – 'Flat Stanley' by Jeff Brown.
	Monday: Activity 1 Listen to Chapter One of the story 'Flat Stanley' on You Tube – link below. <i>Chapter One: Big Bulletin Board</i> Make a list of the positive and negative aspects of being flat like Stanley. Illustrate your work (the link below is an example of drawing Stanley).
	Tuesday: Activity 2 Listen to Chapter Two of the story 'Flat Stanley' on You Tube. <i>Chapter Two: Being Flat</i> Stanley gets a letter from his friend in America, inviting him to go and see them. What might this letter include? Can you write it?
	Wednesday: Activity 3 Listen to Chapter Three of the story 'Flat Stanley' on You Tube. <i>Chapter Three: Stanley the Kite</i> Complete the Reading Comprehension on chapters one to three.
	Thursday: Activity 4 Listen to Chapter Four of the story 'Flat Stanley' on You Tube. <i>Chapter Four: The Museum Thieves</i> Create a 'Wanted' poster to help people identify the criminals who might have stolen the paintings from the Famous Museum.

<u>TOPICS</u>	
D.T.	<p>Stanley doesn't like the disguise that Mr Dart chooses for him. Can you design a new one?</p>
R.E.	<p>Watch the PowerPoint on 'Lent'. Can you remember why Lent is important to Christians? Lent is a time for Christians to remember Jesus' sacrifice and how he resisted temptation. If you were giving up something for Lent, what would it be? Can you write about what it would be? Why would it be difficult? Illustrate your work.</p>
Science	<p><i>Lesson One:</i> Watch the PowerPoint on 'The Lifecycle of Flowering Plants'. Draw/label the lifecycle.</p> <p><i>Lesson Two:</i> Experiment <i>Broad Bean Bonanza</i> You will need two or three clear plastic drinking cups, some plain white kitchen paper and some broad bean seeds.</p> <p>Wrap one sheet of kitchen paper around the inside of each cup, then stuff the centre of the cups with paper as well. Slip a broad bean seed between the cup and the outer sheet of paper, so that it is visible from the outside. Now, water the paper so that it is wet but not soaking, put the cups in a warm, light place, and keep them well-watered. Look at the seeds every day and watch how they are developing.</p>
