

Year 3 Summer Term Two, Week Two – Daily Activities

<u>ENGLISH</u>	Try to read for 20 minutes a day. See the VIPERS document below for some questions you could discuss with an adult. Remember you can access books from the Oxford Owl website. See the link below.
Reading	
Writing	<p>'Lazy Jack'</p> <p><u>Monday</u> – Watch the video clip of the 'Lazy Jack' story. See the links below. Use the picture cards to put them in order then tell the story or make a story map. It is a good idea to watch the video through a second time then pause it so you can do a bit of the story map then watch a little bit more.</p> <p><u>Tuesday</u> – Spelling test. Pick your new spellings from the list. Work on the spelling activity (Magazine match up) from the box below. Use your story map or the picture cards to tell the story. You could make a short video clip for Seesaw, tell it to someone in your house or phone up a relative to tell it to. Extra challenge: complete the sheet finding out the meaning of the words.</p> <p><u>Wednesday</u> – Read the written version of the story. What is the same or different to the video clip you watched? What does Jack's mother keep saying or doing and what does Jack keep saying or doing? Draw pictures of the characters of Jack and his mother and label them with words to describe what they are like as characters.</p> <p><u>Thursday</u> – Read the written version of the story again. Can you pick out the repeated language (the same or very similar things that are said more than once)? Use the repeated language worksheet to write out some of the things that Jack and his mother say to each other.</p> <p><u>Friday</u> – Use the planning sheet to create your own version of the 'Lazy Jack' story. If you would like to make your story a bit longer you could include some more jobs your character does and how he gets paid. We will write this up next week.</p>
Spelling	<p>Ask someone to test you on the spellings you chose to practise last week. Pick 7-10 new spellings from your list (Year 3&4 list or first 200 words). These could still include some of the same ones from last week, if you did not get them correct. Let me know if you get them all right and I will record Dalston Dollar points to add on when we get back to school.</p> <p>Activity</p> <p><u>Magazine match up</u> – if you have some old newspapers or magazines in the house see if you can cut out the (separate) letters to make your words. Stick them down onto a piece of paper. See link below to spelling training website. Try to spend 10 minutes practising your spellings every day.</p>

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MATHS <i>Please note we are doing the alternative Y3 week 7 (Unless you have not already covered the fractions work from week 3)</i>	<p><u>White Rose Maths</u> There has been a real improvement in the speed that you can answer your 3x and 4x table questions. Keep working on Times Table Rock stars to improve your speed. Also, have a go at the times table tester on the website below. You can choose which tables you want to work on.</p> <p><u>Monday</u> – Measure length</p> <p><u>Tuesday</u> - Equivalent lengths m and cm</p> <p><u>Wednesday</u> - Equivalent lengths mm and cm</p> <p><u>Thursday</u> - Compare lengths</p> <p><u>Friday</u> – Find a ruler or tape measure. Measure ten things around the house. See if you can measure them in cm and then convert them to mm or the other way around.</p> <p><u>Times tables work</u> – pick a times table you are not so sure of and work on learning four times table calculations from it. Test yourself each day. Try the times table tester on the link below.</p> <p><u>CGP Mental Maths</u> Complete a couple of pages of your book. You can also access workbooks which can be downloaded from Mathletics. Don't worry about printing them out – working on paper or doing a few mentally is fine.</p> <p><u>Mathletics</u> Try to complete the test if you can. Remember to do it without help.</p> <p><u>Times Table Rock Stars</u> Spend time each day with quick recall of all your times tables. <u>BBC Bitesize Maths</u> is also available to access.</p>
