

# St. Michael's Homework – Class 1

## Spring Term

All homework is split into two sections. Section A is compulsory homework which should be completed each week. Section B is “choices” homework. This half term children should choose at least 3 boxes from Section B to complete. Once they have completed them please sign and date the box. “Choices” may require your child to bring something in to school, to find out about something or to take part in something. Each class will have a special board to display anything the children have completed linked to homework and we would encourage them to bring samples in. “Choices” are generally linked to the class topic or Science learning that they are currently involved in.

### *Section A – Compulsory weekly tasks*

Work on reading and writing two digit, then three or four digit numbers. Make sure you can read them and say how many H T U are in them.	Try to hear your child read as often as possible. ### *Section B – Your choices! Please complete at least 3 this half term.*

Find out about a famous inventor. Write some facts about them to bring in.	Find out a bit more about a mammal, reptile, amphibian, bird or fish and make an animal fact book.	Find out about Beatrix Potter. Read some of her stories and find out why she was famous.
Use watercolours to paint a picture of an animal.	Find some coins in your house. How many different coins can you see? Can you make the same amount in different ways?	Talk to an older relative about how things were different when they were your age.
Cut out some pictures of the royal family from a newspaper or magazine. Make your own mini photo album from paper. Add some facts if you like.	Read the stories from a children's Bible or online about Easter. Draw some pictures or write about it.	Find out what plants are growing in your garden or near your house. Take some pictures or draw them.
